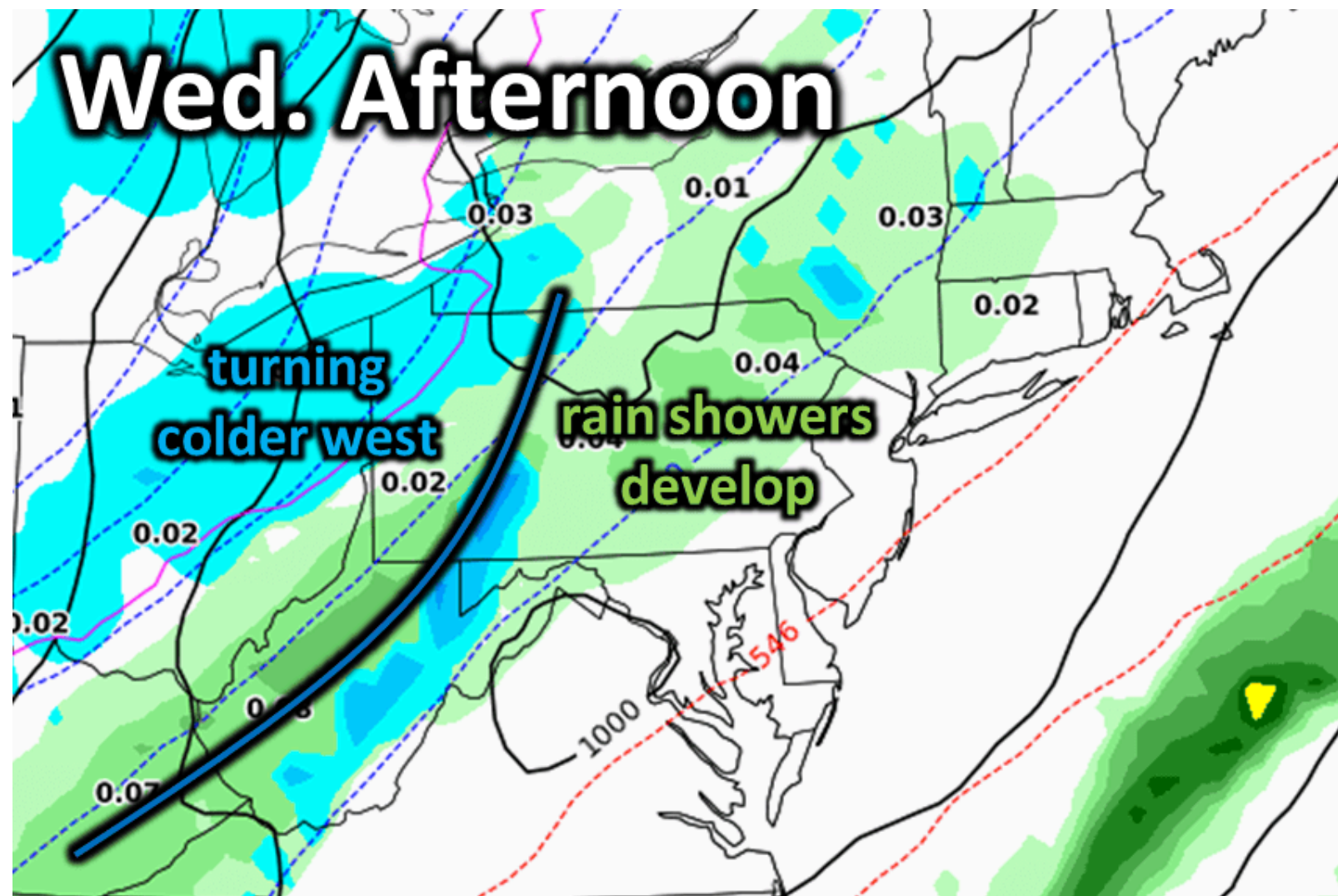


Jan 12th - 16th 2026 Interior Snow Wednesday Night

Above average temperatures will be around the Northeast today with highs in the 40s and 50s for many. A weak disturbance this evening into tonight will likely bring light rain and snow showers mainly from New York into New England. Any minor dustings will favor the higher elevations in Upstate NY to VT-NH-ME.

Then our next system for midweek will develop as a few mainly rain showers for Wednesday afternoon. This can develop into a period of light rain late Wednesday into Wednesday night as it moves west to east across the region. Cold air will be arriving right on the tail end of this system, so we're still watching a window for some backside snow for interior areas. Parts of northern PA, Upstate NY, and northern New England will have the highest odds for accumulating snow, with the potential for a couple inches of snow into the Poconos, Catskills, and Berkshires. Even into NW New Jersey and the Hudson Valley, enough cold air is possible for a coating – 1". Farther southeast, rain can end as some wet flakes even all the way to the coast, but accumulations for the I-95 corridor aren't expected.



Following this system, temperatures will quickly fall after precipitation ends, and even with an increasing breeze, scattered refreeze & slick spots are likely especially NW of I-95 in the Mid-Atlantic late Wednesday night into early Thursday. Farther east, showers will be ending Thursday morning in New England, with falling temperatures during the day.

It will also turn windy Thursday with 30 – 40 mph gusts. This can also bring a few spotty snow showers later Thursday and into Friday, mainly around the Great Lakes. Wind chills will also fall into the single digits Thursday night as cold and blustery weather continues into Friday. A few more mixed snow / rain showers will be possible again on Saturday, though most of the day looks largely dry.
